Artists for Humanity

Artists for Humanity's mission is to bridge economic, racial and social divisions by providing underserved youth with the keys to self-sufficiency through paid employment in the arts. Our \$5.6 million loan supported the renovation and expansion of their facility, where the organizers held a ribbon cutting in the fall. The expansion is the cornerstone in Artists for Humanity's plan to double jobs it offers to young artists.



Horizons For Homeless Children

Roxbury, MA

Our two lines of credit, totaling over \$6 million, to Horizons for Homeless Children financed a new 45,000-square-foot facility in the Roxbury neighborhood of Boston. The new building, whose total cost is over \$60 million, will house Horizons' childcare and support services for homeless children and families. Other tenant organizations in the building will provide employment and training for youth. Horizons is nationally recognized for the quality of its services. The project also will bring 135 jobs to an economically disadvantaged community and is aligned with the Roxbury Strategic Master Plan.
